I am delighted to announce two new venues to add to our book this year:

1) Franks Lake nr. Cadnam.

Day fishing for most species on this 2 acre lake. All swims platformed. Night fishing available following prior permission from the bailiff. Full details in membership book.

2) Hampshire Avon, Hale.

Part of the water previously held for many years by the Hale syndicate. Approximately 1000 yards single bank and 400 yards double bank. Available for Coarse, Salmon and Trout (in season). The 1000 yds single bank has very few trees and is, therefore, ideally suited for fly fishing. So along with Breamore and Lower Breamore there is a good long stretch to suit our 'fluff chuckers'.

venues were not accessible but as normal the minute the close season is upon us, the rivers look superb! Roll on the 16th June.

The winter has had a major impact on most of our stillwaters also, raising the levels considerably which has meant a lot of work by our bailiffs – much of which is still ongoing.

Our first season on Rockford Lake has gone quite well with quite a few 40lbs plus carp taken and many double figure bream and tench and mostly caught in the daylight hours. In view of the quality of fish in this lake, we were very aware of the otter predation in the area so decided to spend a fair amount of money in constructing a fence around the whole perimeter of the lake and our thanks must go to John Sudworth, Ivan O'Connor and your lakes manager who have spent an enormous amount of time completing this venture.

In line with suggestions we have agreed to have a half-day ticket for use with our club boat in Christchurch Harbour. The cost is just £10 per after 2pm providing the boat has not been previously booked. Book with Davis Tackle, Christchurch. Already there are literally thousands of mullet in the river!

Only major problem this season has been permits without members photographs in. This is now an offence whereby you will have your permit taken away. Please be aware.

Whilst on the subject of permits, if you require any additions (e.g. night permit, guest permit etc.) after purchasing your membership book this can now only be done by our Permits Secretary. Please contact her to arrange this.

Thank you to all the committee and, indeed, you the members for a virtually trouble free year and tight lines for the future.

RIVER MANAGER REPORTS

LOWER STOUR and CHRISTCHURCH HARBOUR

I started off last year's report moaning about the floods we had and this year's report is no different.

Harbour

What an incredible fishery this is. You fish it for years and think you have it sorted and then this fishery bites back and proves you wrong. Plenty of roach and dace showed but the bigger roach didn't show in any numbers, bream of good size showed early on then seemed to vanish. The bass fishing was also slower although some good fish were caught. Plenty of sea trout were caught to those spinning for them. Water levels were low and remained low right into the autumn which is probably why the fishing was a bit hit and miss. The one species you can rely on is the mullet and as usual they provided excellent sport. Then the floods came and made it impossible to fish from boat or bank.

The club boat was used a lot and hopefully will be used even more this coming season. So that more people can enjoy the fishing in the harbour the committee has decided that if the boat isn't pre-booked you can have the use of the boat from 2pm for the sum of £10, this is for two people including boat permits (bargain!).

Tuckton to Iford

Some good catches from these stretches but not with any regularity. The low water levels from the start of the season until the floods came made the fishing very patchy and then when the floods came it was impossible to get near the river. This stretch of river always fishes best in the autumn with a little colour in the water but the only colour we got was when the floods came and lasted almost three months.

Above Iford

Again, this stretch suffered with low water levels right up to the floods coming. The weed growth on this stretch was very bad and we had to do a lot of weed cutting to make swims fishable. Lots of bigger bream showed and some anglers were moving swims to avoid them so they could catch the barbel. Plenty of barbel caught from Iford Bridge to Iford weir with several fish to just under 15lb. Once the floods arrived it was some time before you could even get near the river, but as soon as they were just within their banks there were a few chub and barbel caught to those who braved the conditions.

How nice it would be to have what we consider to be normal seasonal conditions! I would like to thank all the bailiffs for their work through the year and let's not forget our local tackle shops and their staff for supplying us with bait and tackle all year.

UPPER STOUR

Hi All,

Well what a disappointing season that was. Early season drought followed by the worst winter I can remember, needless to say the feedback from the Stour bailiffs was not great but considering the conditions for most of the winter it was what I was expecting! Not since the huge floods of the mid to late 70's has the upper Stour been so bad. The committee gave me a puzzled look when I gave my river report and told them that Blandford was now at Wimborne, Wimborne was at Christchuch and Christchurch was somewhere in the English Channel! Anyway enough moaning from me, lets see what the bailiffs had to say.

Bounds Farm bailiff Bill Graham said some good bags of chub came out including a 7lb fish that was caught in a match. A few double figure barbel also came out at the end of the season when the river finally became fishable.

Parley bailiff Alan Wilcox said some good bags of roach came out at the back end of the season. Also some decent barbel showed earlier in the year.

Hampreston bailiff John Rushton said the fishing had been really hard for most of the year, a couple of the stocked barbel from several year ago came out with the best going 9lb 7oz. Some good roach in June - July came to trotted sweetcorn from the weedier glides. Floating crust or mini marshmallows produced some excellent chub from the shallows through the cattle drinks, the last week also threw up some nice chub to ledgered cheesepaste. Grayling show in winter to maggot or sweetcorn in the deeper sandy glides, please handle these fish with care and do not retain them in a keepnet. John also asks members not to enter this fishery during the closed season. He also says if anyone would like a tour of the fishery he would be happy to show them around. Contact me and I'll pass on his details.

Havelins now has a new bailiff Iain Nairn. Not too much to report this year but I know it is still throwing up some nice perch, Good bags of roach when conditions are right which wasn't very often this year! Always plenty of pike on this fishery, mainly jacks but there are some bigger fish to be had.

Well that's it from me so lets hope for a better year to come. Can't be any worse can it!

AVON MANAGER

Many thanks to the bailiffs for their assistance over the last season. A lot of work undertaken by them goes unnoticed but believe me it isn't easy keeping over 7 miles of the Avon fishable.

We have a new stretch of the Avon available at Hale for the forthcoming season, I would appreciate if you could let me know any catch reports from this and other stretches, we use this information to decide whether to renew leases. All the information will be treated as confidential and will not be published unless you give your permission.

Once again the weather from before Christmas until the seasons end was abysmal making fishing most of the river almost impossible. Regardless of this some good catches were taken, the largest barbel being caught by Dave Slaughter at 15lb 4oz. the largest chub was caught by David Rosemund who was on a weeks holiday from Bedfordshire and weighed 8lb 1oz, David had previously caught an 8lb 1oz chub from Throop in 2005, how many anglers have caught 8lb chub from both the Avon and the Stour – very few.

BRAEMORE, FORDINGBRIDGE, BROWNSEYS AND REDBROOK

Very few reports come in from these stretches, more would be appreciated. We had reports at the beginning of the year of lots of rainbow trout being caught, they had obviously escaped from fish farms in the floods. Please be aware that if you catch any out of the river they must not be returned to the water, being a non native species it is an offence to put them back.

IBSLEY

A difficult season due to the conditions but as usual some good fish caught. We have a lot of work to carry out on here during the close season, hopefully all will be ready for September.

SEVERALS

Please be aware you now need a key to access lower Severals, ensure you lock the gate after going through as it was left open and the cows escaped much to the annoyance of the farmer.

A lot of work was carried out on Severals this season, fry bays were created and log deflectors positioned in the river. The work was carried out as a partnership spearheaded by Nick Giles from WCSRT and our thanks go to nick and the other partners, Derek Goulding the landowner, Andy Martin and Jim Wreglesworth from the EA, Trevor Harrop from the Avon roach project and Pete Reading from the barbel society. Hopefully in years to come we will reap the benefit with fry survival and spawning improved on the stretch.

As part of the project the Bickerley Millstream downstream of the bridge at Hampshire Hatches Lane was cleared, unfortunately the bottom stretch where it joins the main river was not completed due to the weather. The plan is to complete this in the spring.

ROYALTY

This is another water that suffered from the conditions but in the last couple of weeks of the season showed an improvement. One of our members Keith Humphreys was playing a barbel on his feeder rod when his other feeder rod went off, the result was that he landed both barbel weighing 9lb 12oz and 10lb 3oz, well done Keith.

FORUM

The forum is going well but as always we would like more members to make use of it.

I would encourage you to join as it is a very good source of up to date information regarding the club, for example we took over Franks Lake before Christmas but I imagine a lot of members wouldn't be aware until they received the newsletter or their new book.

TREASURER

As in previous reports, please be aware that the figures are draft only and have yet to be audited. If anything does crop up during the audit these figures will be amended and correct at the time of the AGM.

So at this stage, I am projecting an excess over expenditure of £21,084.00 for the financial year ending 31st March 2014. Please do not be alarmed at this figure! It does not mean that RDAA are in the red! The figures that are shown are based on our annual income over expenditure throughout the year. It does not include profits from previous years which we use as our reserves. This does happen; the last time was in 2003 and in 1999. I will explain why we have spent more that our income this year below.

Over the past twelve months we have had some very large expenses that have had to be paid for:

Replacement of all locks and issue of new keys to all Members	£4,600

Further Construction of the Junior Lake and Planting	£5,320
Purchase of Lawn Mowers for Rockford and White Lake	£18,000

Purchase of a large Trailer	£1,500
Purchase of new Chain Saws, Trimmers and Hand Tools	£3,000
Purchase of a Container at Rockford Lake	£500
Total:	£111,450

As you can see we have reinvested considerably this year for the future. Obviously as we gain more venues our expenses are going to increase, not only with the cost of the Leases/Purchases but on the maintenance of them. With the Association's annual turnover well exceeding a third of a million pounds, the Committee has to run the Association like a company in some ways, making sure that our members get the best value for money and that we are financially strong for the future of RDAA.

You will notice under the income heading that there is an entry under 'Other Income' for £24,839.00. This is in connection with the terms of our purchase of Rockford Lake from CEMEX. Day Ticket income looks to have grown considerably as well, this is a true figure for this year only due to accounting procedures being different in other years. Hopefully our weather conditions that we have experienced this past year will be different and Day ticket sales will continue.

Under expenditure you will note we have spent £3,744 on fish stocking, we review the need for this on a regular basis, and will probably do additional stocking later this year.

Rent for venues has increased this year mainly due to many of our leases being linked to RPI as well as paying for Linbrook Lake (Half Pit) and the additional expenses of Franks Lake. RPI has run at a reasonably low rate this past twelve months but is forecast to rise over the coming years. Inflation, and its effects, is playing a larger and larger part of the finances of the Association. This is why our costs for Permits have to increase along side it. Again, this has a knock on effect on interest rates, another factor I have to look at due to our loans that we currently have.

The figures for Repairs and Maintenance are explained above, so I won't waffle on about them again. Regarding Committee expenses, I have moved a couple of things this year on how outgoings are recorded on the accounting programme that we use, and moved these into the General section. Bank charges have reduced

which I am pleased about, it's something that bugs me and I dislike having to pay them. The decrease is due to us becoming more efficient and also having the addition of PayPal through the website has reduced our costs.

For this coming year we will have more outlay, we always do! Swim maintenance and flood defence is being carried out currently. I would also like to see Boundary fences improved around the Wash Pit at on the Railway Bank of Hightown Lake. Repayment of the loans for Rockford will have to be met, and as always if funds allow taking on new venues is always a priority.

The final accounts will be available at the AGM in June. Unfortunately I will not be in attendance as I am away fishing the St Lawrence Seaway in Canada. If you do have any questions please do not hesitate to send me an e-mail.

LAKES MANAGER

Spring has sprung earlier this year making a pleasent change, I remember typing this letter last year with the heating on full wack. The lakes have taken a bit of a pounding over this winter what with the very strong winds and, I believe, the highest rainfall in over 100 years some of our lakes have very high water levels and quite a lot of damaged trees. The bailiff team and I will be out in force over this summer repairing and rebuilding swims on all venues. We are currently rebuilding some swims at Rockford Lake then plan to move our attention to the wash pit swims and then onto Hightown. We plan to do some major works up at Hightown later this year as a lot of the swims have become very overgrown with more than a few 40 year old trees which need to be seen to. Some areas/swims may be shut while these works take place.

Once again some excellent fish have been caught from our Lakes over the last year and some records have been broken as we hoped.

WHITELAKE

White Lake has fished very well again this year proving to be one of our top venues. Bream to over 13lb have been caught and the lake has produced its first 40lb carp this year. Some excellent bags of roach are coming out and the catfish have awoken already and are feeding.

LINBROOK LAKE

Always one of our tougher venues to fish, although a lot of people fished it this winter. Some good carp being taken to over 40lb. To quosh any rumours we have just signed a new contrat with the lake owner. Can members make sure they do not park along Snails Lane, there is no access to the lake from here and climbing over fences will result in loss of permit.

WASH PIT

Washpit has fished well again with good bags of bream and carp caught on the float, also some of the night anglers on the Wash Pit have really got stuck into them. Seems this lake really comes alive after dark. Crayfish are being trapped on the lake now as I know a lot of members wanted this to happen we will review this after a full year of trapping to see if it is effective or not. 500 crucian carp were stocked into the wash pit this winter.

JUNIOR LAKE

Well, to my surprise, we have had a 20lb carp caught out of this venue which was returned there. This lake can be excellent for a couple of hours sport and I hope one of the youngsters catches the monster carp on their coaching days through summer.

HIGHTOWN

Hightown has been fishing excellently over the last month a lot of carp and bream comming out. Fifty 4lb-6lb carp were stocked into Hightown this winter. The water level is still extremely high once it receeds we will repair swims and, like I said earlier, some major clearance work may well take place later in the year.

ROCKFORD

Rockford has produced some amazing fish over the last year, it has produced countless 40lb+ fish and has also done bream to over 16lb. Double figure tench have been caught also. It's also an excellent pike venue and fished extremly well for pike over this winter.

The club have spent a lot of money on the otter fencing at Rockford as otters were a serious problem on this venue. I would like to remind members the otter gates must be kept closed and locked at all time. Also any out of bounds areas are totally out of bounds, this means no access for whatever reason.

EVERTON GRANGE LAKES

Fishing over at Everton is superb again this year with lots of tench and carp being caught, this really is a great venue for float fishing and stalking. Excellent early morning venue.

COKING FARM FISHERIES

Coking is fishing very well since the better weather, with some huge carp being caught. Rush Lake is staying as a match lake for the time being. This venue must be checked out if you have not fished it. Excellent complex great onsite tackle shop and an amazing cafe down the road.

CRANBOURNE LAKE

Good bags of carp caught all year round at Cranbourne. This venue is very popular with some members and I know Dave the Bailiff over at Cranbourne is always keeping the lake tidy, best methods here seem to be the float although a feeder rod can be just as deadly.

HATCHET POND

Hatchet has once again thown out some huge carp this year and always does some monster tench and bream. Method feeders are good for the bream and tench but these fish will also come out to the bollie and pva bags. May be worth taking a brolly to this venue as it does get very windy. Make sure it's a good one though, I've seen a few brollies blown inside out and watched anglers running after them. All good fun.

LONGHAM LAKE

Longham has posted carp to just under 38lbs and bream to double figures, plus some excellent pike.

PARLEY LAKE

Parley has taken a bit of downward spiral this year. I know we had an otter set up home on here for a while and it seems the fishing may have slowed down a bit. I think we will have to give Parley a bit of a boost, fish wise, maybe seeing some tench and roach added to this venue shorlty. The track down to Parley has been rutted up very badly as they have been doing lots of digger work here, hopefully, they will level it off over the next few weeks.

WITHERINGTON FARM

All lakes fishing well all year round, for carp, bream and tench.

WHITEMOOR LAKES

The fishing this last year at Whitemoor has been excellent. This venue is well established now as a good match and placasure venue with some surprisingly big carp out last year. Good fishing here all year round.

WHINWHISTLE FISHERY

There is now another lake at this venue for Ringwood members making it 5 lakes in total now. Good bags of fish caught on all lakes. A float rod is all that is needed at Whinwhistle, you don't even need to take any food as the onsite cafe does some superb fishing snacks. No guest tickets on this venue, however, day tickets can be obtained.

AVON TYRELL LAKE

Avon Tyrell is the perfect lake if you have been struggling of late, you should not struggle for a bite here. It has fished very well this year and I am pleased to say you can now exchange your Ringwood permit for a pass at Avon Tyrell instead of going to Ringwood Tackle to swap. Members must book in at Reception before fishing. A must fish venue for the float angler that wants to be busy all day and with some cracking old double figure carp as well as plentiful bream and roach. Please note this venue does have a 3 month close season.

FRANKS LAKE

This is our newest venue and is an excellent match venue, although there are also some large carp and pike. I recommend a trip here if you have not fished it before, on summer days you will not be waiting long before a bite. Also there is a couple of very large pike in this venue. Night fishing is available here but a phone call to book in must be made first, number in permit.

Please check your new permits for rule changes on the lakes this year. I would like to thank all the bailiffs for the hard work they do each year. I must remind members that the bailiffs are there to look after our venues and that's what they do. If anyone is hostile towards our bailiffs, or rude, their permit will be removed immeditaly. These guys give up their free time for our lakes and rivers and we expect them to be treated with the highest respect. As I said earlier we will be out in force this summer repairing areas on the venues so I apolgise in advance for chainsaw noise/digger work while you are fishing but obviously we cannot do this work in the dark, rather than close venues we will close off swims or actually try to close nothing so you can still fish.

All the best to you all in this comming season, I hope you all smash your personal bests.

SPECIMEN REPORT

As has become the norm over the past few years not many fish were reported this year, with only 11 fish weighed in, for specimen trophies. However, 3 of these fish are new club records with the bream record being obliterated with a fish of 16lb 12oz from Rockford captured by Matt Jackson. Both the catfish and pike club records were bettered by 1oz. A catfish of 52lb 13oz was recorded by Paul Brewer from White Lake and a magnificent pike of 31lb 1oz was captured by Peter Kelly from Longham Lake.

Matt Jackson wins the Premier Cup and 1 year free membership for his bream. Andrew Sherman also smashed the previous bream record with a fish of 13lb 9oz and for his efforts wins the coveted Hard Luck Shield. Northfield Lake also produced bream over the 10lb mark with the largest reported by Andy Wyatt of 10lb 5oz.

The severe weather conditions which persisted from before Christmas until the end of the river season meant that much of our river fishing was washed out this year. Only 3 barbel were weighed in (all captured by Andy Wyatt), up to a top weight of 13lb 5oz from the Severals. Two very good pike were weighed in from our rivers and one 7lb 2oz chub.

No carp have been weighed in this year, which is a shame. The Pink One from Hightown is no longer alive but many 40lb plus carp have been captured from Rockford Lake. Hightown has some impressive back up fish and White Lake and The Half Pit have both produced some very impressive specimens this year.

The small number of fish weighed in by our members in no way reflects the quality of the fish in the Association waters. Fish from our waters, and their captors, regularly appear in the angling press but the modern day angler doesn't appear to be very interested in winning trophies any longer.

As long as we are all having a good time and enjoying ourselves that is good enough for me.



Carp over 10lbs must be returned immediately to the water


